Aquatic Invasive Species – Workshop

On March 13th, I attended a workshop in Perth on aquatic invasive species. The workshop was put on by FOCA (Federation of Ontario Cottagers Association) and OFAH (Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters) and was attended by about 40 people representing about 20 lakes and rivers from Eastern Ontario.



The main purpose of the workshop was to provide information of about the invasive species that may threaten our lakes, and to introduce an application called EDDMapS that it is hoped the various lake associations will begin using to collect information about the locations of invasive species in their lake.

An invasive species is defined as a harmful alien species whose introduction or spread threatens the environment, the economy or society. Aquatic invasive species generally become a problem by crowding out other native plants and their thick growth can impede boating and other water activities that we all enjoy around Buck Lake. Invasive species are most commonly spread by boats when they are transferred from one lake or river to another. To prevent invasive species from entering Buck Lake, please inspect and clean the outside of your boat and drain the bilge water before you launch. To help remind boaters, the signs, as shown above, are being posted at the boat launches. Additional signs may be requested by emailing info@bucklake.ca.

There are 8 aquatic plant species that have the potential to become a problem in our area. They are:

Water Soldier – currently only found in the Trent River. Was first detected in 2008

European Water Chestnut – This plant is a big problem in northeastern US. There is not much in Ontario – yet. It is found in 2 locations in Ontario – near Voyager Provincial Park and near Wolfe Island

Hydrilla – Not found in Ontario, yet, but is in many locations close by.

Eurasian Water-Milfoil – Found in many Ontario lakes, including Buck Lake.


European Frog Bit – Floating leaf about the size of a toonie

Yellow Iris – Bright yellow flowers – there is a similar blue iris which is a native plant and is ok

Fanwort – Only found in one small localized area in Ontario. Can be purchased in pet stores for use in aquariums and get into lakes if not disposed of properly

Water Hyacinth – Forms dense, large floating mats. Shades out submerged plants and other organisms

The other half of the workshop focused on the use of the EDDMapS System. EDDMapS is a database that was created by the University of Georgia in 2005, and is being used by many provinces and states throughout North America to monitor the spread of invasive species. It currently contains 2.2 million records (17,530 from Ontario). The request from FOCA is to have lake associations from Ontario, gather additional data about the current state of invasive species in their lakes. To assist with this, an app (iOS and Android) has been developed for entering data into the system. The app also has lots of information and pictures for all of the invasive species. It is worth downloading just to have a look. Search for EDDMapS in either the App Store or the Google Play Store.

This summer, Terry Demers and I plan to do a survey of Buck Lake and enter the data into the system. Part of the survey involves taking pictures of anything we think might be an invasive species and an expert will review the images to ensure the data is correct. If anyone is interested in getting involved and helping out with the survey, let me know.
